The Rights of People with Cognitive Disabilities to Technology and Information Access

What is happening?

People with cognitive disabilities have an equal right to technology and information access. A coalition of disability organizations and individuals asserted this right in a formal declaration, announced at the Thirteenth Annual Coleman Institute National Conference on Cognitive Disability and Technology, in 2013. We invite all of you to read this declaration, [The Rights of People with Cognitive Disabilities to Technology and Information Access](#), and to affirm your commitment to the equal rights of people with cognitive disabilities to technology and information access by endorsing it on the website. In the United States people with cognitive disabilities often have limited access to technology and information access.
