Marc J. Tassé PhD, is a Professor in the Departments of Psychology and Psychiatry and the Director of The Ohio State University Nisonger Center, a University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities. He is a licensed psychologist. Tassé has 25 years of experience in conducting research and providing clinical services in the field of intellectual disability (ID), autism spectrum disorder (ASD), and other related developmental disabilities (DD). He has given 200+ training's, workshops, and presentations related to ID, ASD, and related developmental disabilities. His publications include more than 100 articles in peer-reviewed journals, chapters, and books in the area of intellectual and developmental disabilities. Tassé is co-author of the AAIDD (2002 and 2010) Terminology and Classification Manual and AAIDD User's Guide (Schalock et al., 2012). He has also co-authored several published standardized assessment instruments, including the assessment of adaptive behavior, assessment of problem behavior, and measurement of support needs. He is the senior author of the Diagnostic Adaptive Behavior Scale, to be published in early 2016. Tassé is a Fellow of the American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (AAIDD), American Psychological Association (APA), and International Association for the Scientific Study of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IASSIDD). He also consults and testifies in capital cases involving the determination of intellectual disability. He is a Past-President of the American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.
